Development of Landscape Architecture from World War II to Present: Discussion of major movements as a foundation for contemporary landscape design. Also, large scale land use planning, resource management, conservation and the impact of high density housing, mass transportation systems and the information age.

Contemporary Landscape Design: Difference between the modern movement (1930-40's) and contemporary design. The integration of landscape design and architecture.

Design for the Future: The challenges in design for urban planners, landscape architect and designers and others concerned in landscape design.

Redesign of Areas: Some conditions that call for a redesign of a site i.e. defective materials, overgrown plants, changes in life style, social patterns, maintenance capabilities, safety and security measures, etc.
